Let's Study!

and = addition or combination

My friend **and** I attended the meeting.

for = explains reason or purpose (just like "because")

I go to the park every Sunday, **for** I love to watch the ducks on the lake.

but = contrast

I'm tired **but** happy.

or = choice

Would you like tea **or** coffee?

neither and nor = negation

She spoke **neither** German **nor** French.

so = purpose or result

Erick was cold, **so** he put on a coat.

yet = Introduces a contrasting idea that follows the preceding idea logically (similar to "but")

I always take a book to read, **yet** I never seem to turn a single page.
