What will you do in the following situations: Choose between A and B



1. You bought a newspaper with a torn page.

A: ask for a refund B: ask the store to replace it



2. You bought a new table with a damaged top.

A: ask for a discount B: return it



3. Your friend gave you a chipped mug

A: tell your friend about it B: say nothing and repair it



4. You had your clothes cleaned by a laundry shop, but you found it had a stain on it.

A: wash it again by hand B: ask the laundry shop owner to pay for it



5. Your friend borrowed your CD and now it has a crack on it.

A: ask for a replacement B: ask your friend to repay you







Another way of stating the problem

1. The tabletop is damaged. There is a damage on the tabletop.

2. The mug is chipped. There is a chip on the mug.
