Read the Article:

TOKYO — Japan's five-year commitment period to **trim down** greenhouse **gas emissions** under the Kyoto Protocol began on Tuesday as industries, households, transport and other sectors increase energy-saving efforts **to curb global warming**.

To meet the target, Japan plans to rely on **forest absorption** for a cut of 3.8% and the **acquisition** of emission credits from abroad for a reduction of 1.6%, meaning that the country would effectively be obliged to cut domestic emissions by 0.6%. The six **greenhouse gases** covered by the Kyoto Protocol are carbon dioxide, methane, dinitrogen monoxide, hydrofluorocarbon, perfluorocarbon and sulfur hexafluoride.
