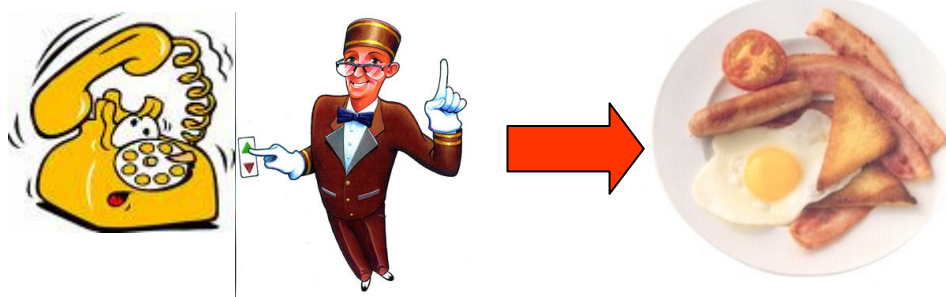


Room service (ordering meals)

Room service: So I'm going to repeat your order sir.

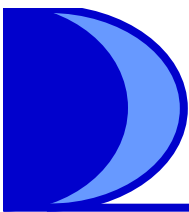
Jun: Okay!

VOCABULARY	MEANING
1. What would you like to have?	- Eggs with the yolks and whites beaten together and cooked to a firm but soft consistency
2. How do you like your eggs?	- Fried only on one side.
3. Scrambled egg	-Asking what the person wants to order.
4. Sunny side-up	- Eggs cooked by sautéing in oil or butter; sometimes turned and cooked on both side
5. Fried	- Asking how the costumer would like the egg to be cooked. Like scrambled, sunny side-up, boiled and fry.
6. Boiled egg	- Immersing the egg in boiling water with their shells unbroken.

7. Crisp	- Confirming the order
8. I'd like to order... - Can I have? - I would like some...	- The ordered food will be delivered in a few minutes.
9. That's right - that's correct	- Hard but easily breakable; brittle. It makes a crispy sound.
10. Your order will be right with you. - Your order will be served in a few minutes.	- Telling someone's order to a waiter or waitress.
