

# 5.) Oh no! It's snowing!

## /ɔ/ and /oʊ/

### Sound 1:

/ɔ/ is the sound in **saw**, **daughter**, and **bought**.

To make the /ɔ/ sound:

- pull your tongue back
- open your mouth a bit, and push your lips forward a bit



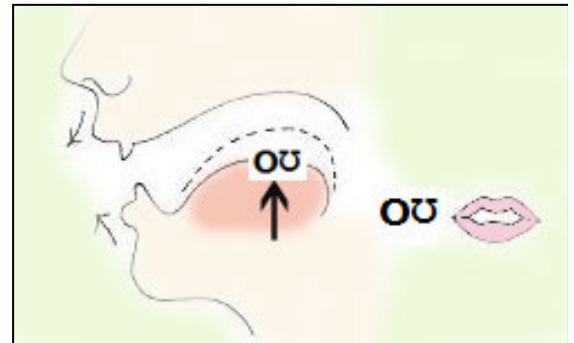
### Sound 2:

/oʊ/ is the sound in **go**, **nose**, and **slow**.

To make the /oʊ/ sound:

This sound has two parts.

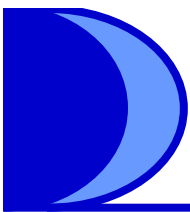
- First, practice the /ɔ/ sound.
- Next, pull your tongue up a little, then push your lips forward into a circle.

## 3. ACTIVITY A:

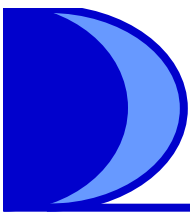
Listen to your teacher read each group of words, then type the word with the different vowel sound in the chat window. Then, read all the words in the activity after your teacher has checked your answers.
